In "Le hirāk du Rif et la diaspora en Europe: Espaces mentaux enchevêtrés," Dr. Christoph Schwarz (associated scholar of politics, Philipps-Univeristät Marburg, Germany) focused on the activists of the Moroccan Hirāk movement based in Europe around 2017. The author discussed the entangled positions of European activists between Europe and their home country, Morocco (specifically the Rif region). He argued that the politicization and mobilization of a Rif diaspora has produced an identification not only with the Rif but also with Europe. These are transnational practices, an example of entangled mobilities in the Maghreb.

The MECAM Spring Talk with IFG IV: Resources & Sustainability presented Dr. Wissem Ajili Ben Youssef's (postdoc, ESLSCA Paris Business School, France) research on Extra-financial Rating Agencies. Dr. Nadia Mansour (senior lecturer of economics, University of Sousse, Tunisia) presented her paper. The conference was accompanied by Dr. habil. Entangled Histories: The Black Movement in Tunisia and the Criminalization of Racial Discrimination Through Law 50

In this Spring Talk, Shreya Parikh (PhD candidate, University of North Carolina, USA) traced the intertwined histories of the Black movement and the development and implementation of Bill 50 to the present day. She described the development of Bill 50 as a project that emerged from conversations in anti-racist organisations led by Black Tunisians. She then presented cases that have made use of Law 50 and the challenges that remain for its implementation. Parikh concluded by reflecting on the implications of this entanglement for the thinking and writing of blackness in Tunisia.

Agriculture et changement climatique : Changement de paradigmes pour un développement durable des zones arides et désertiques tunisiennes

In this MECAM Spring Talk organized by IFG IV: Resources & Sustainability Prof. Dr. Mohamed Neffati (professor of geography, Institut des Regions Arides, Tunisia) spoke on "Agriculture et changement climatique : Changement de paradigmes pour un développement durable des zones arides et désertiques tunisiennes". Lisa M. Sarida Lippert (PhD candidate, Karl Friedrich von Weizäcker Center for Science and Peace Research ZNF, Germany) opened the Spring Talk and Rym Ben Zid (expert in agricultural development, African Development Bank) discussed Prof. Dr. Mohammed Neffati's paper. The agricultural sector in Tunisia occupies an advanced position in the national economy and plays an important role in social and regional development. In addition to the profound socio-economic changes that have visibly impacted the agricultural sector, the greatest challenges facing this sector are water shortages, recurrent droughts, soil degradation, loss of local genetic resources and the environmental crisis resulting from climate change.
